The **Greater Nipissing Stewardship Council**

(GNSC) is comprised of a diverse group of individuals representing the following interests: First Nations, fisheries, tourism, conservation, forestry, agriculture, wilderness sports, biology, youth, public-at-large and the environment. Originally founded in 1999 as the Lake Nipissing Stewardship Council, the GNSC is a charitable organization that partners with similarminded groups and government agencies to implement environmental programs; provide information on conservation and sustainability; and to increase awareness of the ecosystem. The Council relies upon a strong core of volunteers from member organizations to implement many of its initiatives.

2012 GNSC Work Plan

The Stewardship Council has approved the work plan that will guide this year's projects and activities. include Ongoing projects the McQuaby Lake Walleye Monitoring Project, now in year 4 of 9, which will include a spring walleye spawning survey, shoal cleaning (if required) and continued lake-wide voluntary closure of the walleye fishery and the Lake Nosbonsing Loon Educational Project.



Discussions are underway to initiate a northern afforestation program, which would replace the rural tree plant program that has faced several challenges, most notably a lack of adequate funding year to year.

Another project in the works is the development of a *Greater Nipissing Eco-Tourism Guide*, which would see the creation of a geocache program to promote awareness and appreciation of our green spaces.

The latest production in our "Do Your Part" campaign on Invasive Species, which aired last August on CTV and Cogeco and was published in the North Bay Nugget, will also include the posting of signage at several key access points on Trout Lake this summer.

Ice Fishing Code of Ethics - "Showing You Care"

With the new ice fishing season now here, it is a good idea to review the "Ice Fishing Code of Ethics", commonly referred to as the pledge card, developed about 8 years ago by former Lake the Nipissing Stewardship Council, local interest groups and individual



anglers, in an effort to keep Lake Nipissing in a healthy state. The practices outlined should be applied to any lake where you enjoy ice fishing.

Some of the key points include:

- Use barbless hooks and do not release live bait
- Fish for species other than walleye, if you are not going to keep it, put it back promptly
- · Fish for yourself, take only what you need
- Do not leave your garbage out on the ice, bring it back!
- Do not dump grey or dirty water back in the lake zero tolerance for anything down the hole
- If your vehicle is not safe for the road, i.e. leaks oil and fuel, keep it off the ice!
- Take your hut off as soon as possible, don't wait
